

Tshisa Geza – An All Inclusive Bathroom Solution

For the price of an average business lunch, RDP and Low Cost homeowners can have their quality of life drastically improved with the installation of a bath, basin and hot water system.



Piet Uys, the inventor and CEO of Tshisa Bathrooms explains, “What I have done is designed a cost effective geyser that would save on electricity and fit into any RDP home so that families could bath in hot water, a luxury that many of us take for granted. The reality is that RDP houses have only one cold water tap to supply the entire house and normal geysers cannot be installed as only 10-20 amps of power is supplied to each home. Everything from lighting, fridges, heaters and kettles must be run from this single supply.”

It is perhaps the simplicity of its design that makes the geyser so appealing. With a similar shape to a toilet cistern, and working on the same water inlet principals, it is constructed from polypropylene and has a capacity of 65 litres of water. It is fitted to any brick wall by means of three raw bolts that are supplied, each of which is

capable of holding up to 350 kilograms. Each unit is fitted with a sixty degree centigrade thermostat, an inlet valve to control water flow, two recessed taps and an element, with power being supplied from a standard wall plug.

Another key design is the fact that the element is positioned lower than the outlet taps thereby ensuring that it is always submerged in water. “The entire system is gravity fed and does not need the services of a plumber or electrician to install. The unit is economical, not only in terms of initial price and installation, but also in electrical costs as it only uses electricity when required. It is also SABS and government approved” says Piet

Whilst it is possible to purchase the Tshisa Geza on its own, Tshisa Bathrooms also supplies a package that includes a bath and a basin. "A Tshisa Geza, basin and bath can be installed currently for around R1750.
